Dear Parents and Carers,

You will have received information that school received notification from Ofsted that an inspection of both School and Residential provision took place this week. I would like to thank all of you who were able to complete and return the parent questionnaire. Similarly, I would also like to thank the pupils for their returned questionnaires. During the inspection pupil voice was really positive and clear. I had the opportunity to thank all pupils who took part in the inspection for their support during the Friday Gold Star celebration assembly.

The next stages of the inspection process are quite lengthy. The draft report will be available to Governors following a series of quality assurance and factual accuracy checks up to 30 days after the inspection. The timeline for the residential report is similar at 28 days.

Parents evening turnout was higher than usual this year. I understand that life is very busy but am grateful for the effort and commitment from families and carers to attend parents evening. The feedback you have provided has been fed back by staff. It is more than pleasing to hear your comments and how well you feel your children are doing in school.
