Dear Parents and Carers,

School breaks up for the Easter break to-day and will re-open for pupils on **Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> April.** Staff will be in school on **Monday 15<sup>th</sup> April** to access training to further support pupil literacy skills via the 'Accelerated Reading Programme'.
