This autumn, all young people aged 12 to 15 are being offered a first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. Public Health England has updated its [page of resources for young people and their families](#) with [answers to some frequently asked questions](#).

Please continue to record all results from student and pupil onsite testing

Schools and colleges have now welcomed the majority of pupils and students back for the start of the autumn term. All pupils should now have completed two onsite lateral flow device (LFD) tests.

It is important all test results are reported. The asymptomatic test site (ATS) test results you reported on your individual school or college account via the [NHS Test & Trace log results website](#) are

used to calculate funding, so all results should have been recorded (both positive and negative results), to ensure your setting receives the correct funding. If your school or college has not recorded the results from your onsite asymptomatic testing following your pupils' or students' return, please record these now so that any funding can be correctly calculated for your setting.
