



Junior Award Scheme for Schools (JASS) is a progressive learning programme for young people which has been designed to recognise wider achievement. A key aim has been to meet the challenges of the transition from primary to secondary but in practice it can be used at either level as well as with wider age groups in Additional Support Need settings.

Since September 2020 Greenbank School have been taking part in the JASS scheme for years 7,8 and 9.

The National Curriculum states that schools must promote mental and physical development of pupils and prepare them for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of later life.

JASS is an ideal way of meeting these criteria because it develops interpersonal skills, communication, problem solving and team work, and builds self-confidence and a sense of self-wellbeing. JASS can produce successful learners, confident individuals, effective contributors and responsible citizens.



JASS is fully inclusive and the Award can be gained by individuals from all backgrounds and abilities.

JASS is structured into four sections, designed to stretch different aspects of developing confident individuals.

- **My Interests:** developing an interest or learning a new skill
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- **Get Active, Stay Active:** taking part in sport and physical activity
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- **Me and My World:** contributing to the local community
- **Adventure:** outdoor activity and learning, including team work and problem solving

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
