Dear Parents and Carers,

You will be aware that on Monday school received a call from Ofsted to inform school that a school inspection would take place this week. Arrangements were put in place to welcome the inspection team from Monday. This included an opportunity for parents, pupils and staff to complete a survey. Thank you for those of you who took the time to complete the survey. I counted 51 responses, which is huge and made a very positive impression on the inspection team. Some parents had conversations with the team- again I would like to thank you for taking the time to share with the team your experience and that of your child during their time at school. Staff and pupils were absolutely amazing this week- I shouldn't be surprised, as they are amazing every day, every week. Their behaviour choices and attitudes are exemplary- the team actually asked 'How do you do this?' 'The atmosphere and climate you have generated here is very rare'. Needless to say, I was delighted with the outcome. In terms of next steps, I am unable to share with you the outcomes until the report has been though a quality assurance process. This takes 30 working days. As soon as I have the final report, I will share it with you. From here we will continue to develop and improve school. We do so with new Teaching Assistant staff and additions to the management team- a new KS3 manager (Mrs Meadows), a new KS5 manager (Miss Lobina) and a new interim Deputy Head Teacher (Mr Power). Exciting times ahead. Thank you again for your support and belief in school.

You will receive to-day new Short Term Outcomes for your child. These are taken from the EHC Plan and will be a focus for the next term.
