School Inspection Report update

Following a school inspection visit on 21st January, the final report was received by school this week. A copy of the final report is attached to this letter and has been posted on the school website. I want to thank all the staff, pupils, governors and parents for their support over the last 22 months following the 2023 inspection visit. Greenbank School has always been an excellent school, with a proven track record for supporting pupils, gaining ambitious outcomes that set young people up for the next stages of their lives, where they continue to build on their success at school. The report includes how much pupils contribute to the success of school and I am ambitious for this journey to continue.

School Attendance

Regular attendance at school is proven to support the learning and progress children make. It also supports wider holistic development that increases a child's life chances and opportunities. As an ambitious school our attendance target for pupils is 96%. The current attendance figure for school from September is 92.9% (the National Average is 83.1%). Whilst we are significantly above the National Average, there is still more work to do to get to our target. Parents can check their child's attendance pattern by logging on to 'Arbor'.
